For the first time, the 16th annual iConference will feature both in-person *and* virtual participation options. This means authors and applicants can make submissions secure in the knowledge that they will be able to present accepted work and participate in the conference, regardless of any future travel or budget uncertainty. The in-person portion of iConference 2021 will take place in Beijing, China, March 28-31, 2021. iConference 2021 is hosted by the iSchool at Renmin University of China and presented by the iSchools organization. All information scholars, researchers, and practitioners are encouraged to make submissions.

WHAT: The iConference is an annual gathering of a broad spectrum of scholars and researchers from around the world who share a common interest about critical information issues in contemporary society. Since 2005, the iConference has fostered interdisciplinary discourses that push boundaries of information studies. THEME: The theme of iConference 2021 is Diversity | Divergence | Dialogue, and the aim is to bring together thinkers and leaders from academia, industry and not-for-profit organizations to discuss emerging challenges and potential solutions for information and data management in our rapidly changing world. Contributors are invited to examine the theme from social, economic and technological perspectives.

WHERE: The in-person portion of iConference 2021 will be hosted in Beijing, China, a world-famous city with a rich cultural history extending back more than 3,000 years. The conference will be set in the city center with easy access to hotels, historic sites, restaurants, shops and public transportation. The virtual portion of iConference 2021 will take place entirely online in the weeks leading up to the Beijing event. The live and virtual participation options and rates will be fully explained when the conference opens for registration in Fall 2020.

TRACKS: The iConference presents rigorously peer-reviewed research, as well as providing a venue for thought-provoking interactive sessions and colloquia. FULL RESEARCH PAPERS

Full research papers should present new and original research results from empirical investigations and experiments, or from theory and model development. Each paper will be refereed in a double-blind process and accepted papers will be published in Springer's *Lecture Notes in Computer Science*. The full research paper judged the best of the iConference will receive the Lee Dirks Award for Best Paper. Authors will express a non-binding preference for in-person or virtual presentation when they submit.

SHORT RESEARCH PAPERS

Short research papers encourage the iConference community to explore new, provocative and cross-cutting themes. They might include, but are not limited to, critical literature reviews of an emerging topic, theory building that is in the early stages of development, or new analysis or methods applied to existing data. Each paper will

be refereed in a double-blind process and accepted papers will be published in Springer's in *Lecture Notes in Computer Science*. Authors will express a non-binding preference for in-person or virtual presentation when they submit.

POSTERS

Posters provide a short, interactive form of presentation and should present new work, preliminary results and designs, or educational projects. Authors will submit a detailed abstract for double-blind review. Selected authors will subsequently create a poster for presentation at the iConference that is based on their abstract. Authors will express a non-binding preference for in-person or virtual presentation when they submit.

WORKSHOPS

Workshops can be half- or full-day and are intended to foster interactive discussions, especially focusing on topics associated with the iConference 2021 theme. SESSIONS FOR INTERACTION AND ENGAGEMENT (SIE)

These sessions provide an excellent opportunity to present ideas, facilitate discussions, and foster knowledge sharing in unconventional ways. Proposers are encouraged to step "out of the box" in proposing unique and provocative sessions. Formats can include, but are not limited to, panels, debates, fishbowls, research critique, performances, storytelling, roundtable discussions, wildcard sessions, demos/exhibitions, installations and more. We expect these on-site sessions to be participatory, informal, engaging, and pluralistic. Proposals must follow the guidelines on our website and will undergo single-blind review.

DOCTORAL COLLOQUIUM

The Doctoral Colloquium provides doctoral students the opportunity to present their work to their peers and faculty members, and engage with one another in a setting that is relatively informal, but that allows for the fullest of intellectual interactions. Students receive feedback on their dissertation work from faculty and student peers. Participation in the Doctoral Colloquium will be restricted to students who have applied for and been accepted into the Colloquium. Applicants will express a preference for participating in-person or virtually when they submit.

EARLY CAREER COLLOQUIUM

The Early Career Colloquium provides a high-quality learning and networking opportunity for early career researchers (e.g., assistant professors, early career lecturers, post-docs, or others in pre-tenure positions) who work in an iSchool or similar department, or who want to work in an iSchool. Participants will engage in collaborative inquiry and scholarly discourse to improve their possibilities for a future career in an iSchool. This year’s colloquium will focus on the topic of “Collaborative Teaching and Research in Crisis.” Prospective participants must apply and be accepted in order to take part. Applicants will express a preference for participating in-person or virtually when they submit.
